OBJECTIVE:

- Identify, Plan and Prepare for various types of Emergencies and Disaster
- Reduce risks from natural or man-made errors. Ensure recovery from major scale of catastrophe. Ability to recover and operate after event of disasters.

NATURAL DISASTERS



Types of Disasters:

1. Natural: (Earthquakes, Tsunami, Floods, Hurricanes, Extreme Heat, Landslides, Volcanic Eruptions, etc.)
2. Technological: (Hazardous material spill, nuclear power plant accident.)
3. Intentional: (Terrorism using biological, chemical, nuclear, or explosive weapons of mass destructions.)

In the event of a disaster, main things to consider are:

- Make a Plan
- Prepare Food and Medical Kit for about 14 days
- Stay informed with the latest news

Make a Plan:

- Make plans to secure your home or property (install hurricane clips and storm shutters, etc.)
- Review insurance coverage policy. All important documents such as: (Identification Cards, Insurance Policies, Medications prescription, home, car, jewelry, etc.) Ensure to take pictures, videos, and inventory.
- Generate a plan for families, line of communications, at least two known locations to meet, food and water supplies, and emergency kit.
- Ask local Humane Society for information to prepare a plan for pets. Find out shelters that will accept pets to plan in advance.
