CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

The Project Manager, Rider Levett Bucknall is working on presentation boards to deliver to owners at the June 24, 2021 board meeting. These boards will remain in the meeting room for residents to review at their convenience. Information will also be posted on the website. We encourage your attendance and participation.

INSURANCE

The Association requires all owners to have an H06 policy. Please review your insurance policy as the Association's deductible <u>increased</u> to \$10,000. For example, if water leaks from your toilet's wax seal to the unit below. The homeowner of the "source unit" is responsible for the repairs up to \$10K. If you have coverage for loss assessment your insurance will cover the cost of the repairs up to \$10,000 minus your deductible. If you don't have insurance you will be responsible for the cost of the total loss up to \$10,000. Damages that exceed \$10K are covered by the Association's master policy and will be repaired as originally built. The AOAO's policy does not cover any upgrades or improvements made within a unit.

AMENITIES

The Board was happy to announce the opening of our amenities on June 9, 2021. It is wonderful to see residents using the amenities again! Sanitizing stations are available for you to wipe down the tables and chairs. Please remember to do a health & wellness check prior to using any amenities and please stay home if you are sick.

HOME MAINTENANCE TIPS





Do not flush "flushable wipes", trash, paper towels or feminine products down the toilet. It does not breakdown and can cause a clog in the drain line



Typical lifespan of a water heater is 8-10 years. If you have an original water heater consider replacing it soon to avoid any leaks



Garage door maintenance is recommended every 18 months



Inspect for leaking valves or fixtures and have it fixed right away to avoid leaks to your home



Dryer vents are recommended to be cleaned annually. Reduces the risk of fire, improves dryer efficiency which means lower costs and fewer repairs,

removes allergens and reduces drying time.

HURRICANE SEASON

HURRICANE SEASON: JUNE 1-NOVEMBER 30, 2021

BE PREPARED!

"There is a 45% chance of near-normal tropical cyclone activity during the Central Pacific hurricane season this year, according to NOAA's Central Pacific Hurricane Center and NOAA's Climate Prediction Center, divisions of the National Weather Service. The outlook also indicates a 35% chance for below-normal activity, and 20% chance of an above-normal season. For the season as a whole, 2 to 5 tropical cyclones are predicted for the Central Pacific hurricane region. This number includes tropical depressions, named storms and hurricanes. A near-normal season has 4 or 5 tropical cyclones."
